At ASSETS, we remain steadfast in our mission to cultivate entrepreneurial leadership to create economic opportunity. With the support of our community, we've deepened our impact and opened doors of opportunity for entrepreneurs from all walks of life.

This year, we made significant strides in driving economic growth. We distributed 30 micro-loans, totaling \$310,000 in direct community investment, empowering local entrepreneurs to turn their visions into reality. Additionally, we provided \$75,000 in grant funding to further support the resilience and innovation of small business owners in our region. These efforts are a testament to the power of collaboration and the transformative impact of targeted resources.

To address this, we launched a groundbreaking 0% interest small-dollar loan program designed to help individuals secure sustainable funding without the burden of high-interest rates. This year, we trained and provided resources to 306 entrepreneurs, helping them embark on entrepreneurial journeys with confidence. Each person represents a story of courage, innovation, and determination to shape a better future for themselves and their families.

Together, we are building a more inclusive, human-centered economy that uplifts every corner of our community. Fueling Change

In January 2024, ASSETS restructured its Lending Department and launched the **Small Dollar Loan**, a **0% interest loan** ranging from \$500 to \$2,500.

ASSETS believes that equitable access to capital empowers entrepreneurs to achieve individual business success while driving the collective growth of vibrant, sustainable communities. This commitment reflects our mission to build a human-centered economy where all can prosper.

Idea Incubators:

Turning Bold Ideas Into Thriving Businesses

At ASSETS, we're proud to offer two dynamic Idea Incubator programs—**Pitch & Brew** in the spring and **The Great Social Enterprise Pitch** in the fall—designed to help local entrepreneurs transform innovative ideas into impactful businesses. These incubators provide essential training, mentorship, and resources to validate and refine business concepts, de-risk plans, and foster meaningful connections.

Pitch & Brew: Held each spring, Pitch & Brew offers an interactive, supportive environment for aspiring entrepreneurs to test their ideas in a collaborative setting. Participants gain valuable insights from peers and mentors, fine-tune their business concepts, and refine their pitching skills while building a solid foundation for success.

The Great Social Enterprise Pitch: Our fall Great Social Enterprise Pitch focuses on entrepreneurs committed to using their businesses as forces for good. This incubator equips participants with tools to align profitability with social and environmental impact, helping them craft sustainable business models that address real-world challenges.

Gain hands-on training, develop an MVP, create financial models, network with entrepreneurs and mentors, and craft a polished pitch to attract investors in just nine weeks.

10 Steps to Starting a Small Business Seminar January 24, 2024

In this class, participants explored the foundations of developing a strong business idea. Through guided steps, they assessed the feasibility of their concepts and identified strategies to refine and improve them, setting the groundwork for successful business ventures.

T.H.R.I.V.E. Emerging Leaders Webinar March 21, 2024

T.H.R.I.V.E., which stands for Train, Hope, Rise, Innovate, Venture, Elevate, is an executive-level training series aimed at accelerating the growth of high-potential small businesses across the United States. Participants engage in advanced learning opportunities designed to enhance their business strategies and drive sustainable success.

How to Get Certified as a Women's Business Enterprise Webinar March 26, 2024

This webinar provided an overview of becoming certified as a Women's Business Enterprise (WBE), covering the benefits of certification, eligibility requirements, the application process, and how to leverage the certification to grow your business. Participants gained insights into accessing a vast network of women entrepreneurs and corporate and government partners through WBENC, the largest certifier of women-owned businesses.

Business Compliance & Insurance Seminar April 25, 2024

This in-person seminar, led by Gabby Vasquez of Harbor Compliance and Jay Gandy of Enders Insurance, explored entity, tax, licensing, and insurance requirements across multiple states. Participants gained insights into managing compliance, mitigating risks, and leveraging regulatory requirements to foster business growth.

Harnessing the Power of Mental Health as an Entrepreneur Seminar May 23, 2024

This lunch-and-learn, in partnership with Touchstone Foundation, featured mental health expert Tamra Miller-Spence sharing strategies to balance well-being with business demands. Participants gained insights to thrive personally and professionally.

The Reimagining Our Community (ROC) Giving Circle is a community-funded initiative led by the ROC Cohort to support BIPOC-owned small businesses. It provides financial awards to 501(c)(3) non-profits that offer or aim to develop programs, services, or products to aid business development and sustainability in Lancaster County. The goal is to bridge resource gaps, ensuring equitable access, participation, and implementation of services.

Money, Money, Money February 8, 2024

This free event by Cultivate Lancaster showcased funding options for startups and small businesses in Lancaster. Participants attended workshops on accessing and preparing for funding, engaged in Q&As and one-on-ones with experts, and learned about local funding opportunities to support business growth in 2024.



Youth Entrepreneurship Program with The Mix April 22-24, 2024

This year, ASSETS proudly partnered with The Mix to launch the Validator cohort, a unique program designed to introduce underserved middle and high school students to entrepreneurship as a viable and exciting career path. Through an interactive curriculum, 13 students explored the fundamentals of business planning, market research, and innovation, culminating in team presentations of their business ideas.

SheBIZ RoundTable with SCORE June 6, 2024

The first SheBiz Circle, hosted with SCORE, featured breakfast and conversations with local entrepreneurs. Attendees gained valuable insights into state grants and business opportunities.
